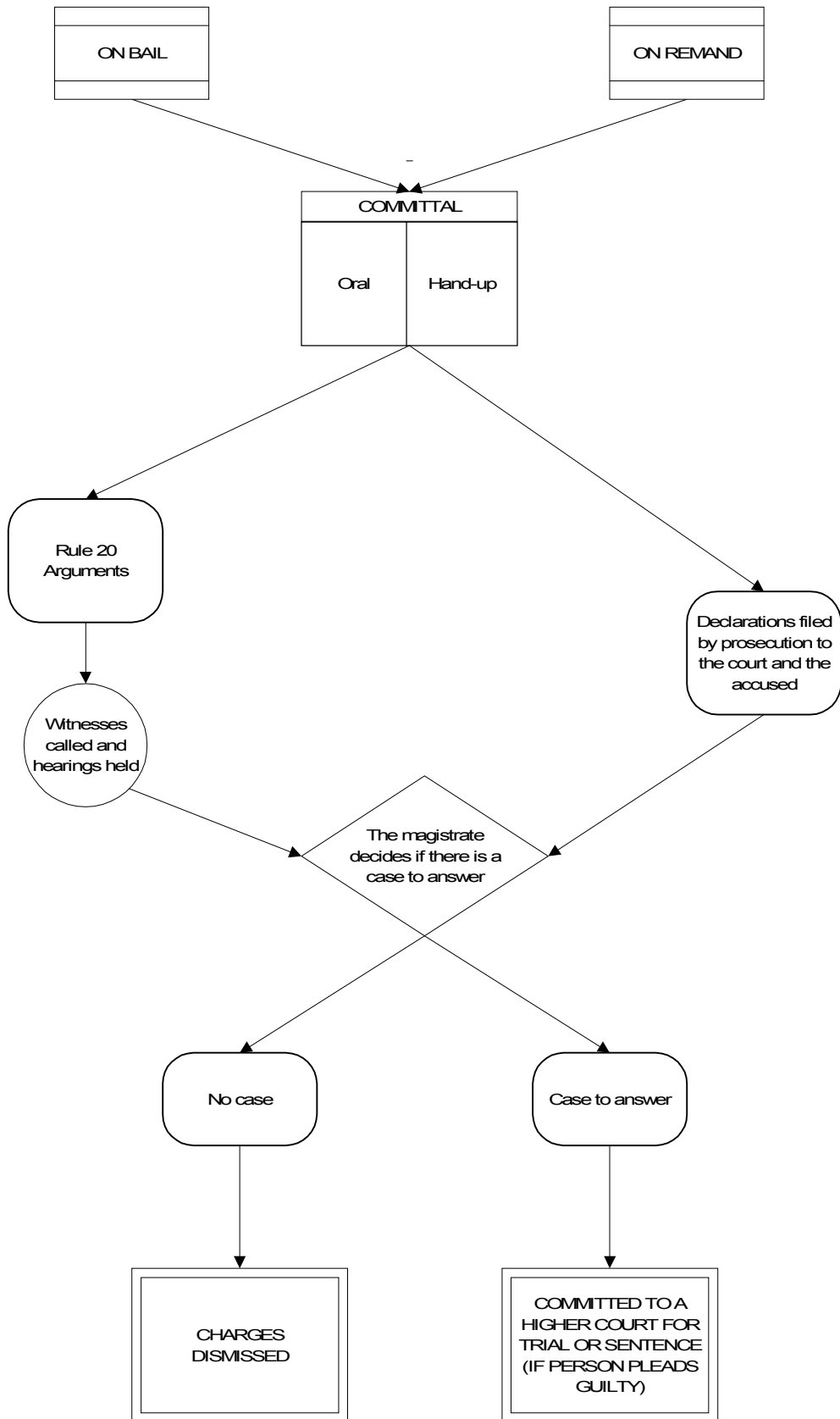

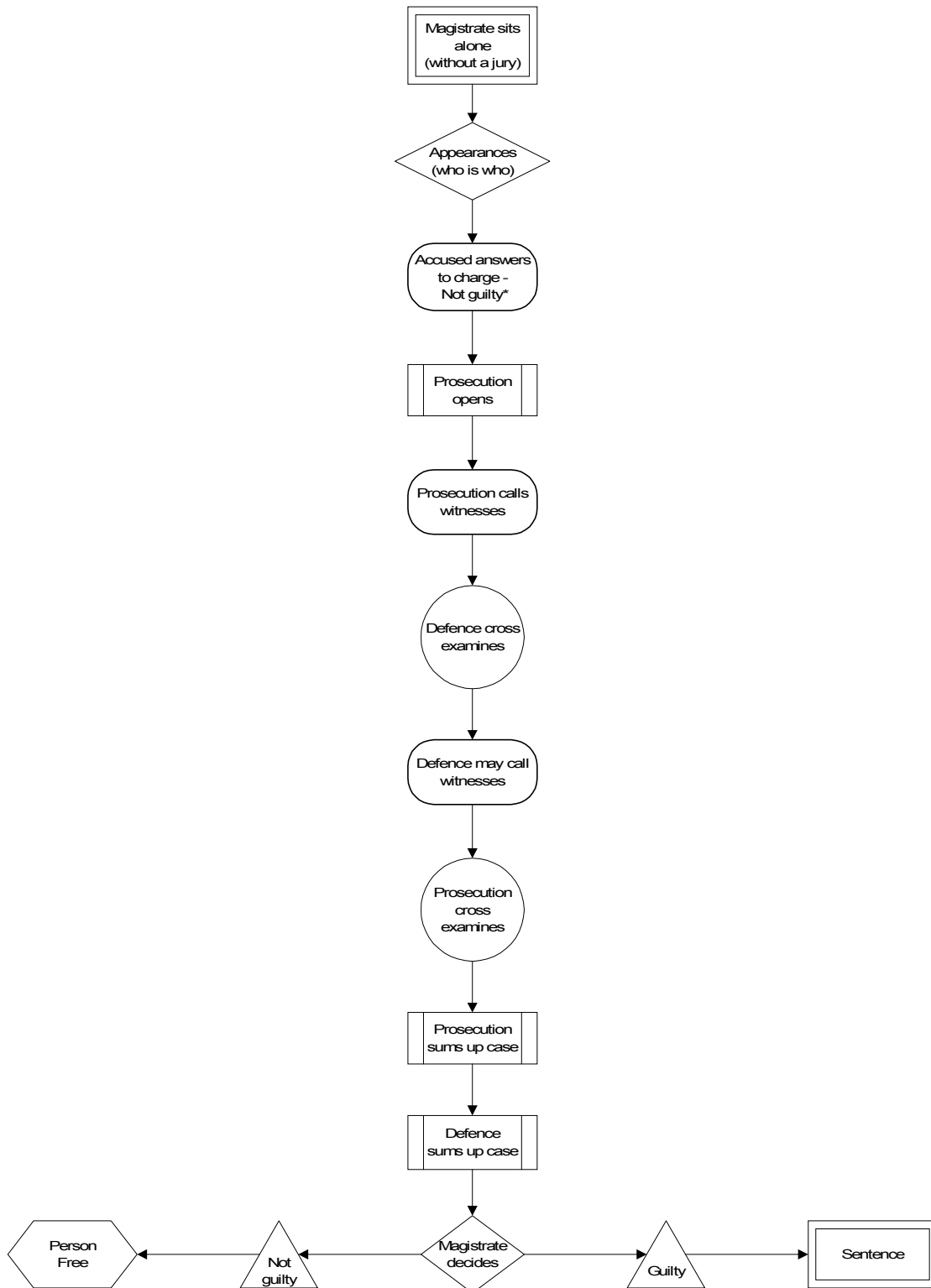


MAGISTRATES COURT - COMMITTAL PROCESS

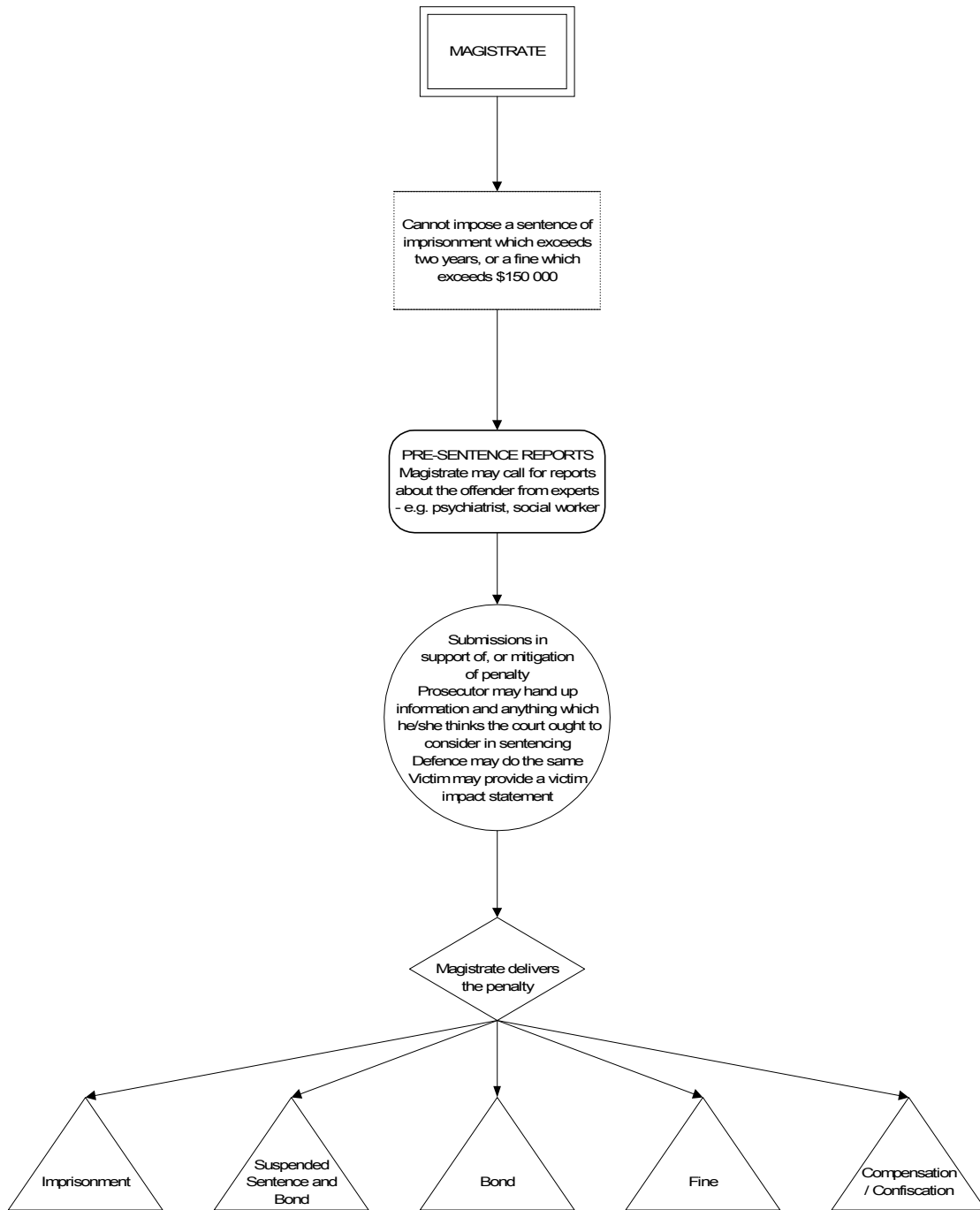
THE TRIAL PROCESS



* If the person declines to answer, he/she is presumed to plead not guilty

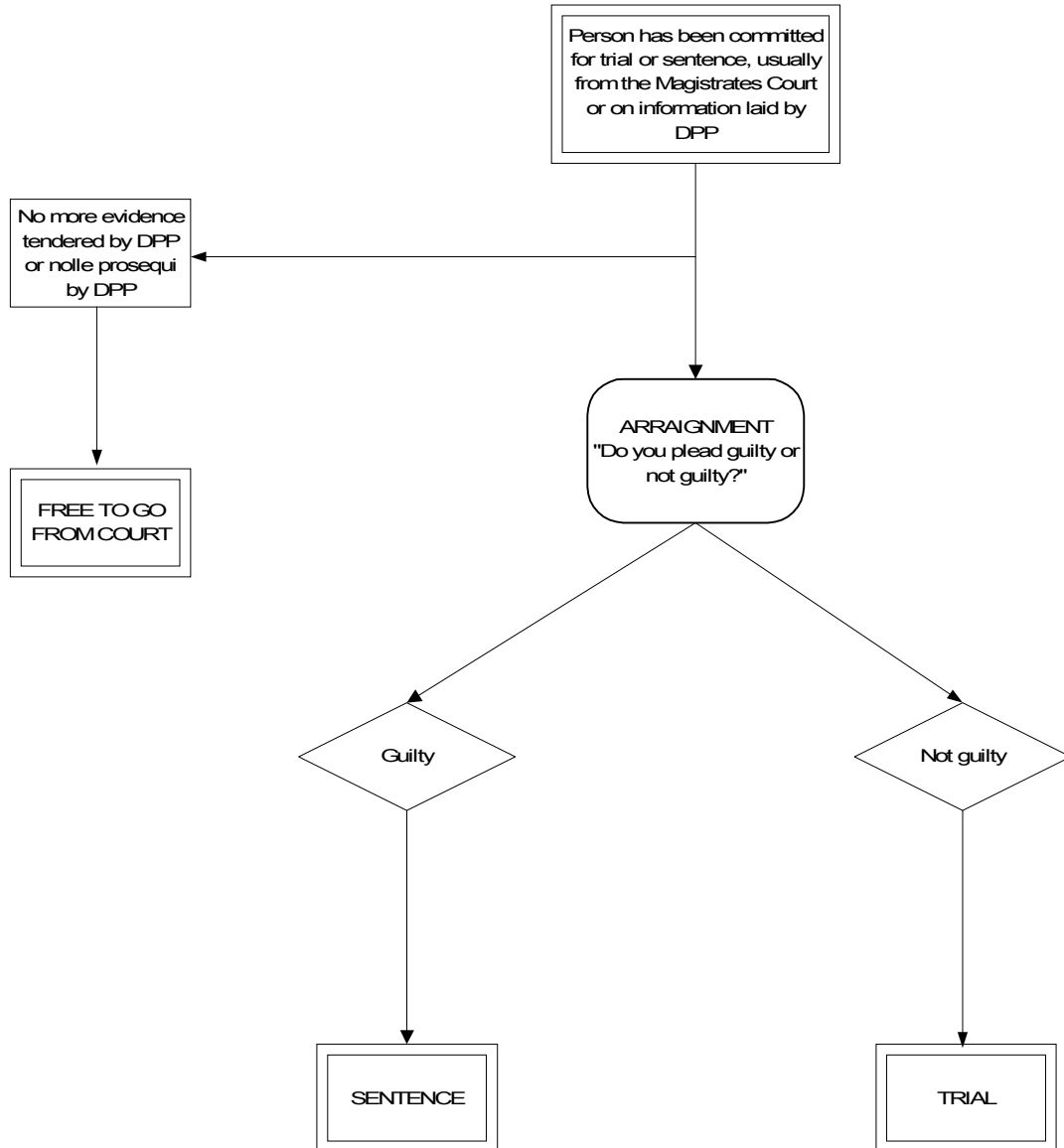

SENTENCING PROCESS

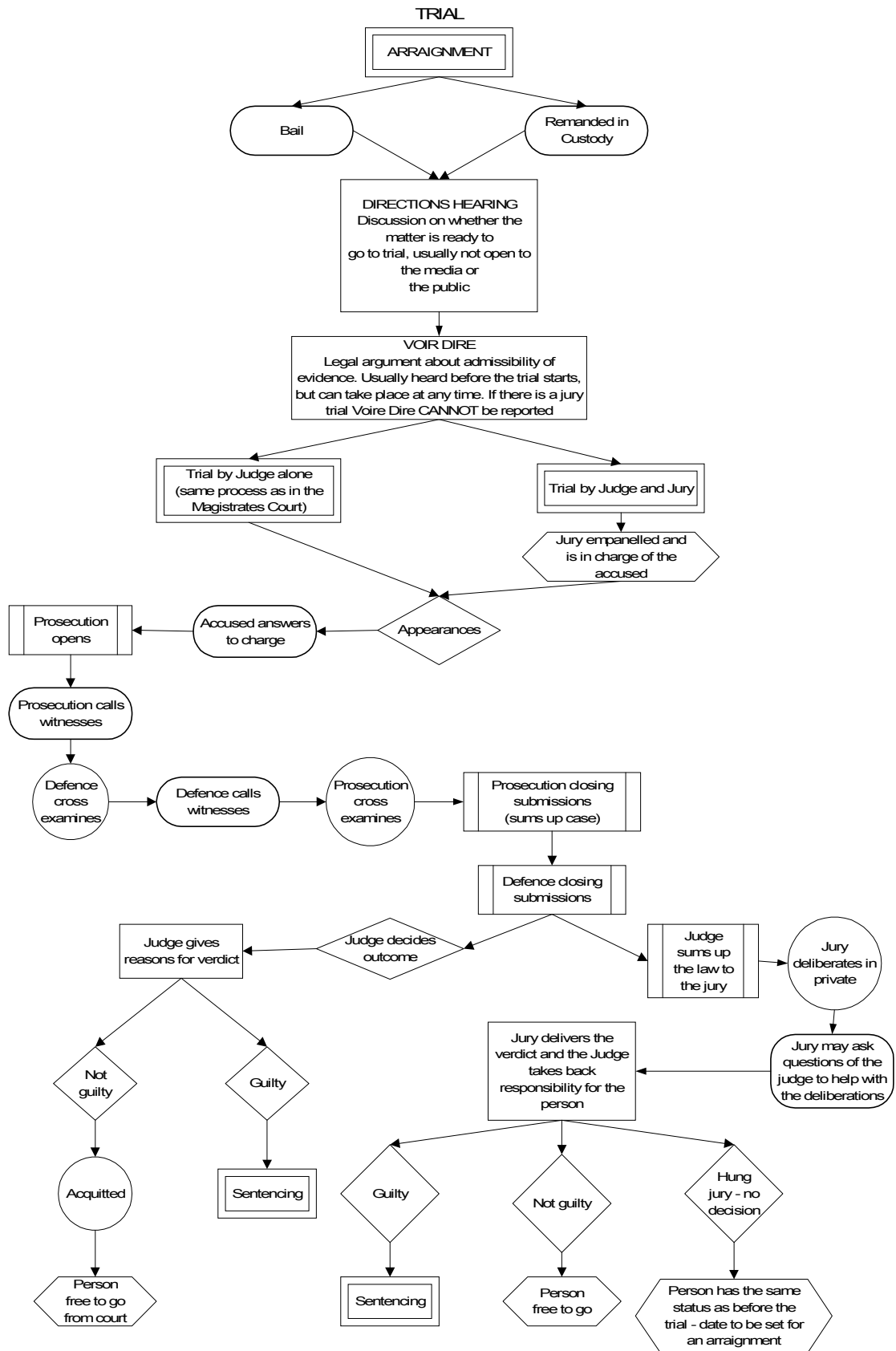


SUPREME COURT AND DISTRICT COURT

CRIMINAL ARRAIGNMENT

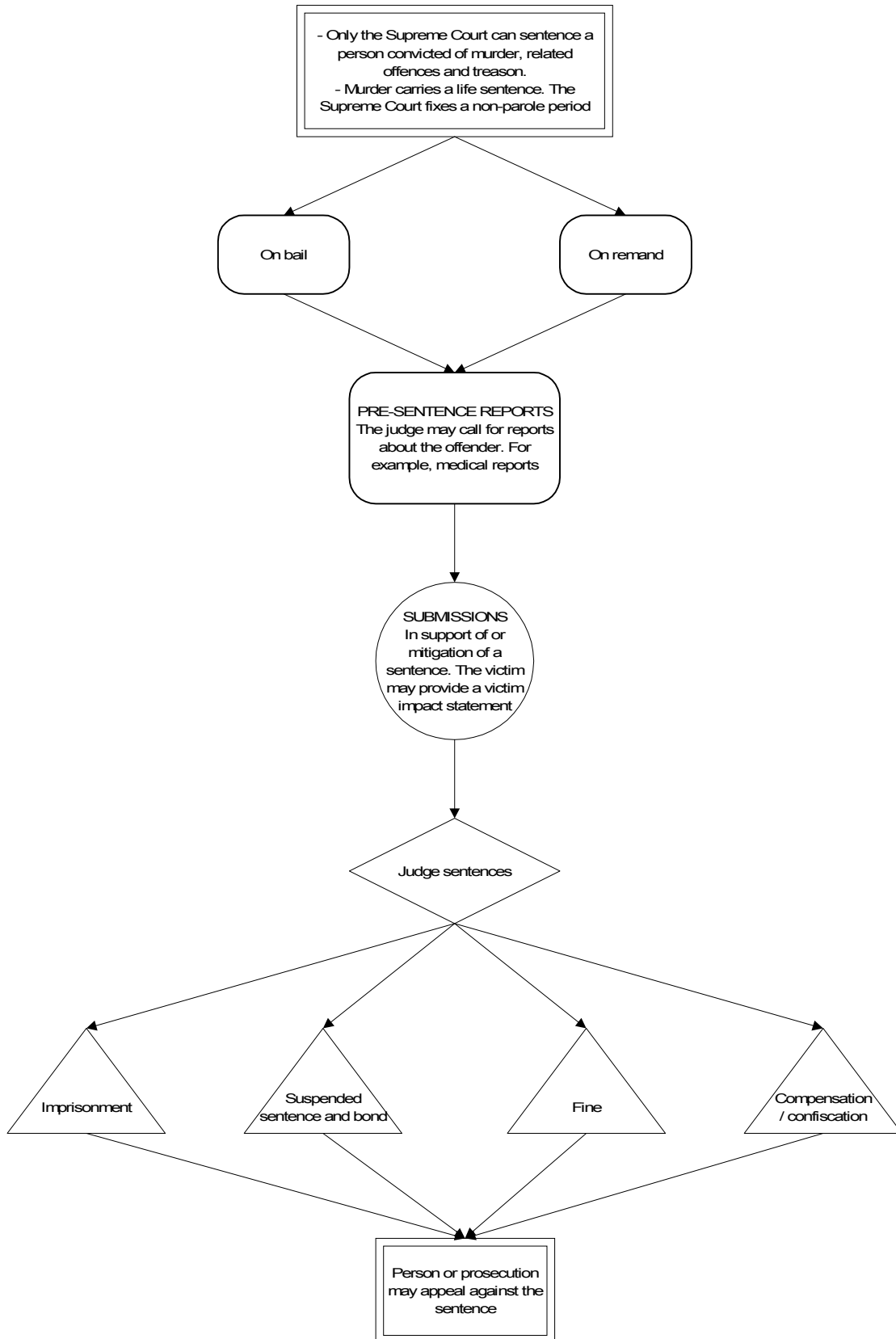

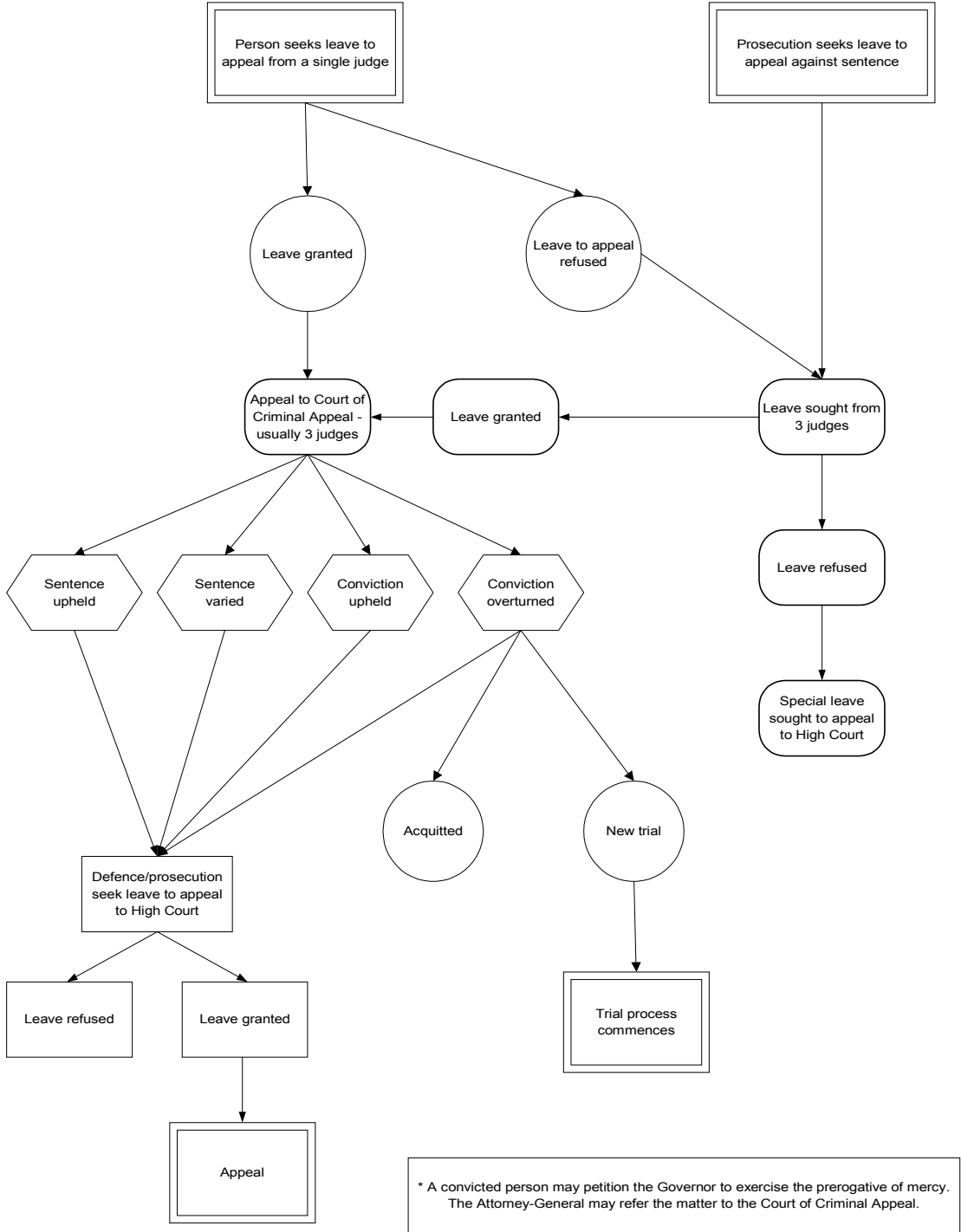

CRIMINAL SENTENCING

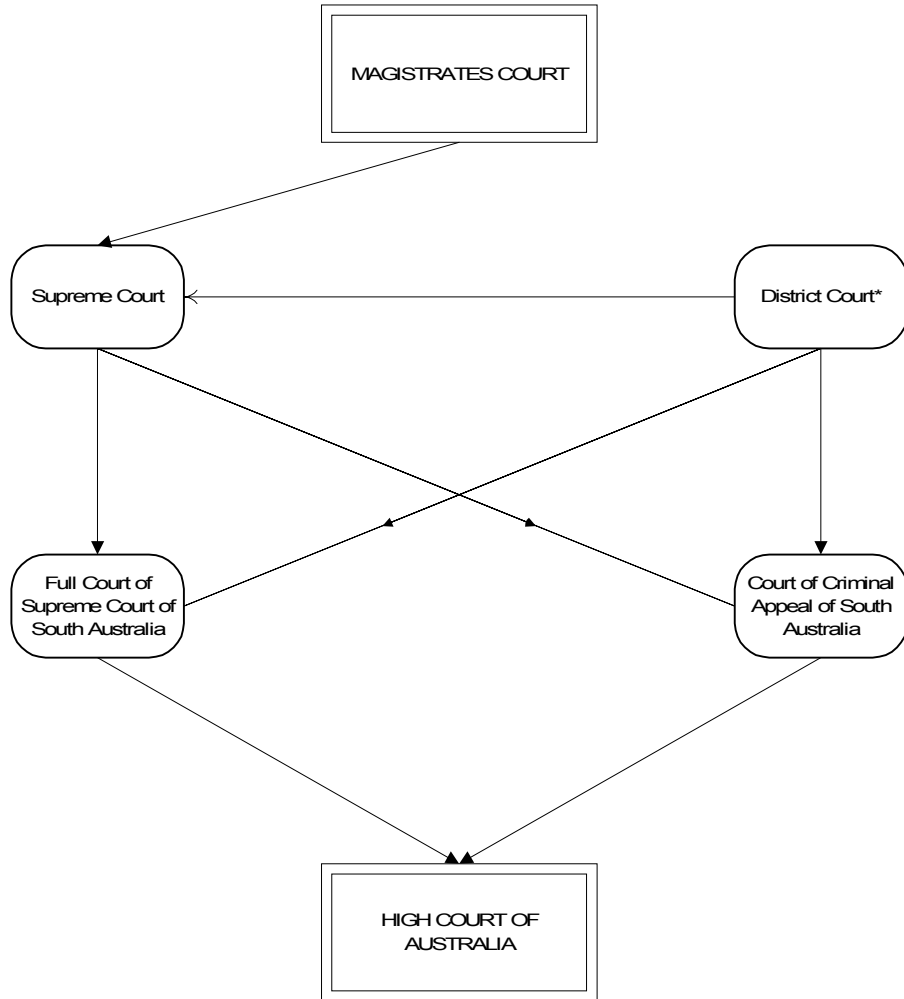


APPEALS - COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEAL



* A convicted person may petition the Governor to exercise the prerogative of mercy. The Attorney-General may refer the matter to the Court of Criminal Appeal.

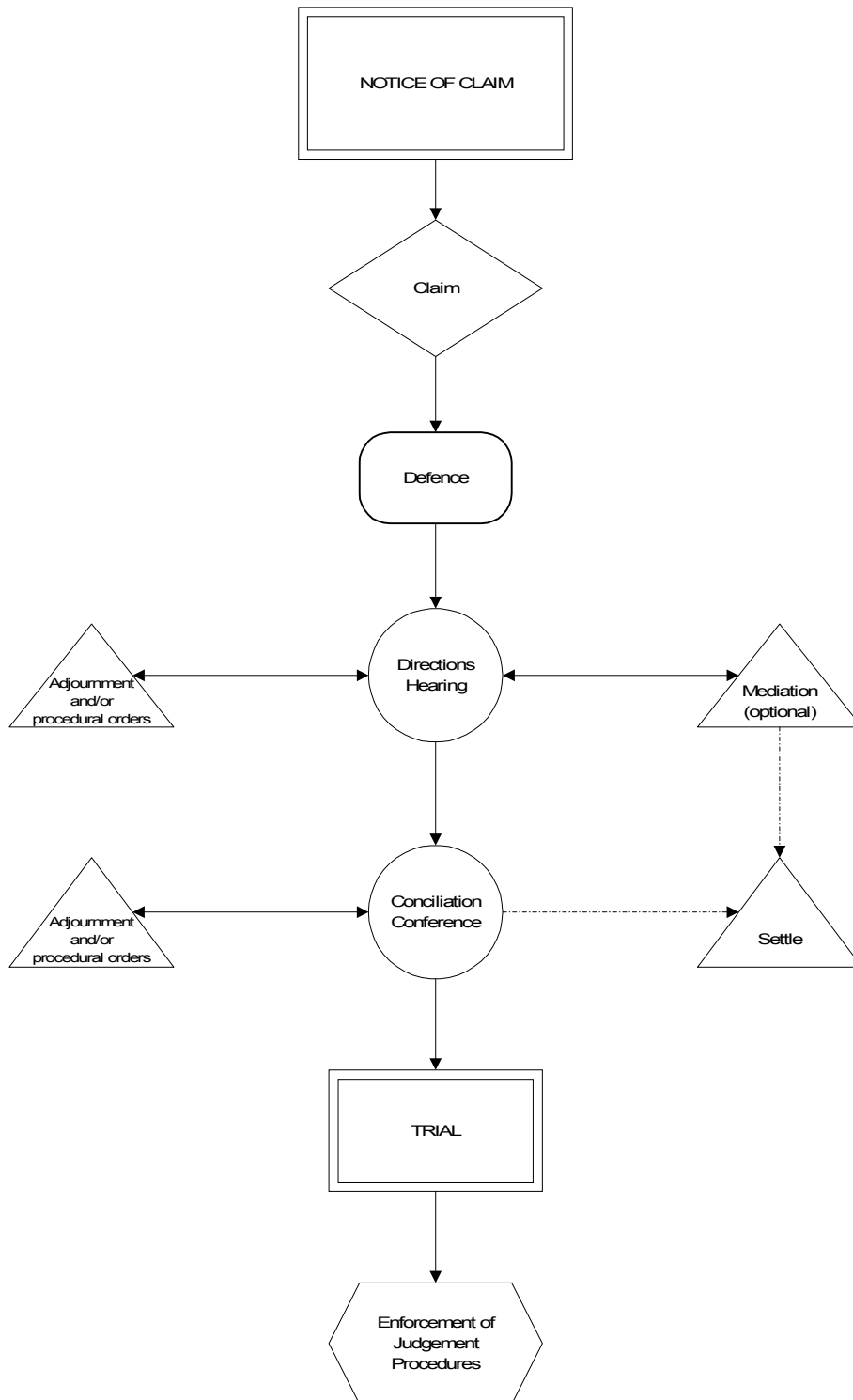

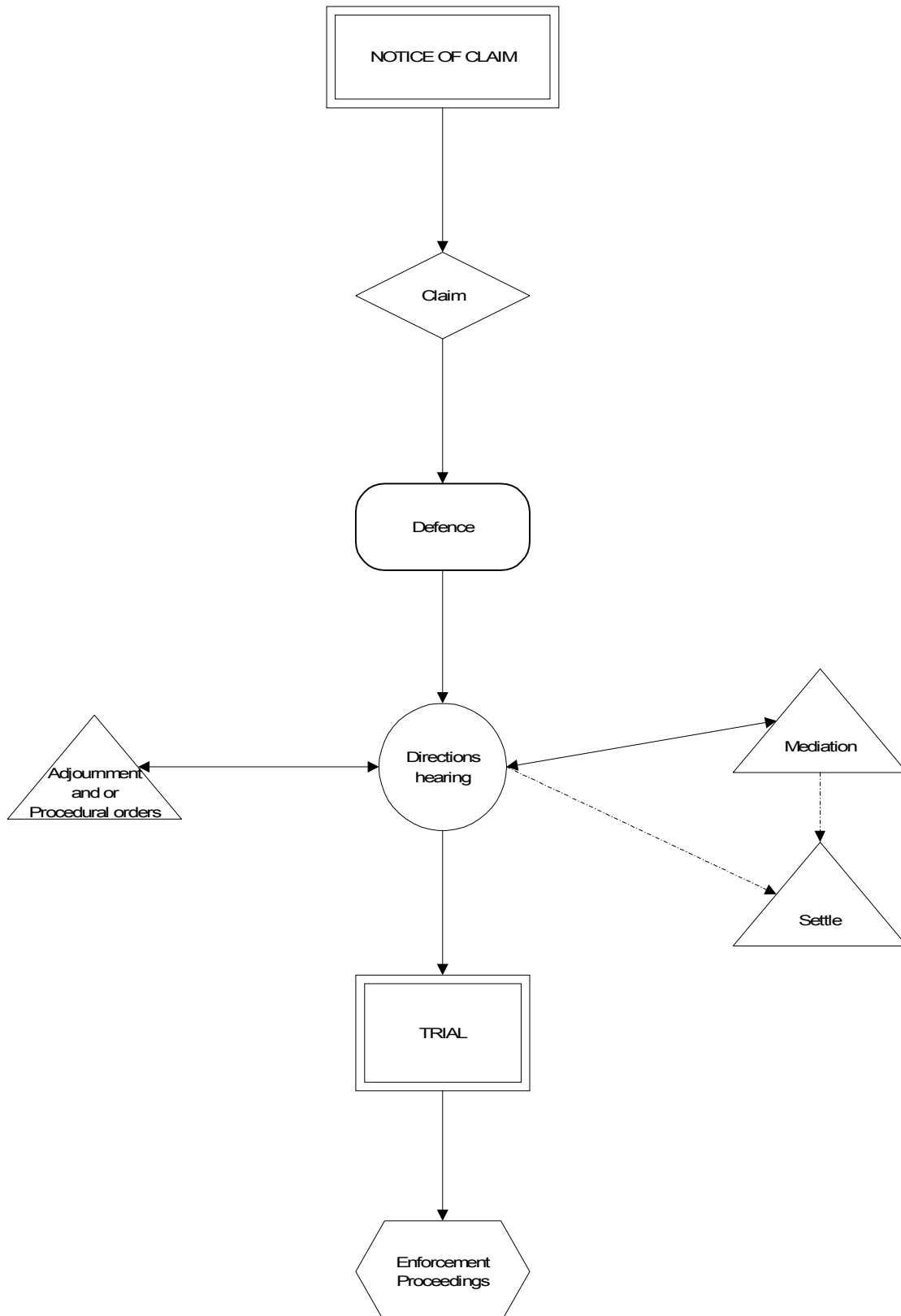
* Appeals against decisions of a Master of the District Court are heard by a single Judge of the Supreme Court.

GENERAL AND PERSONAL INJURY CLAIMS (\$5,000 - \$30,000 OR \$60,000 DEPENDING ON TYPE)

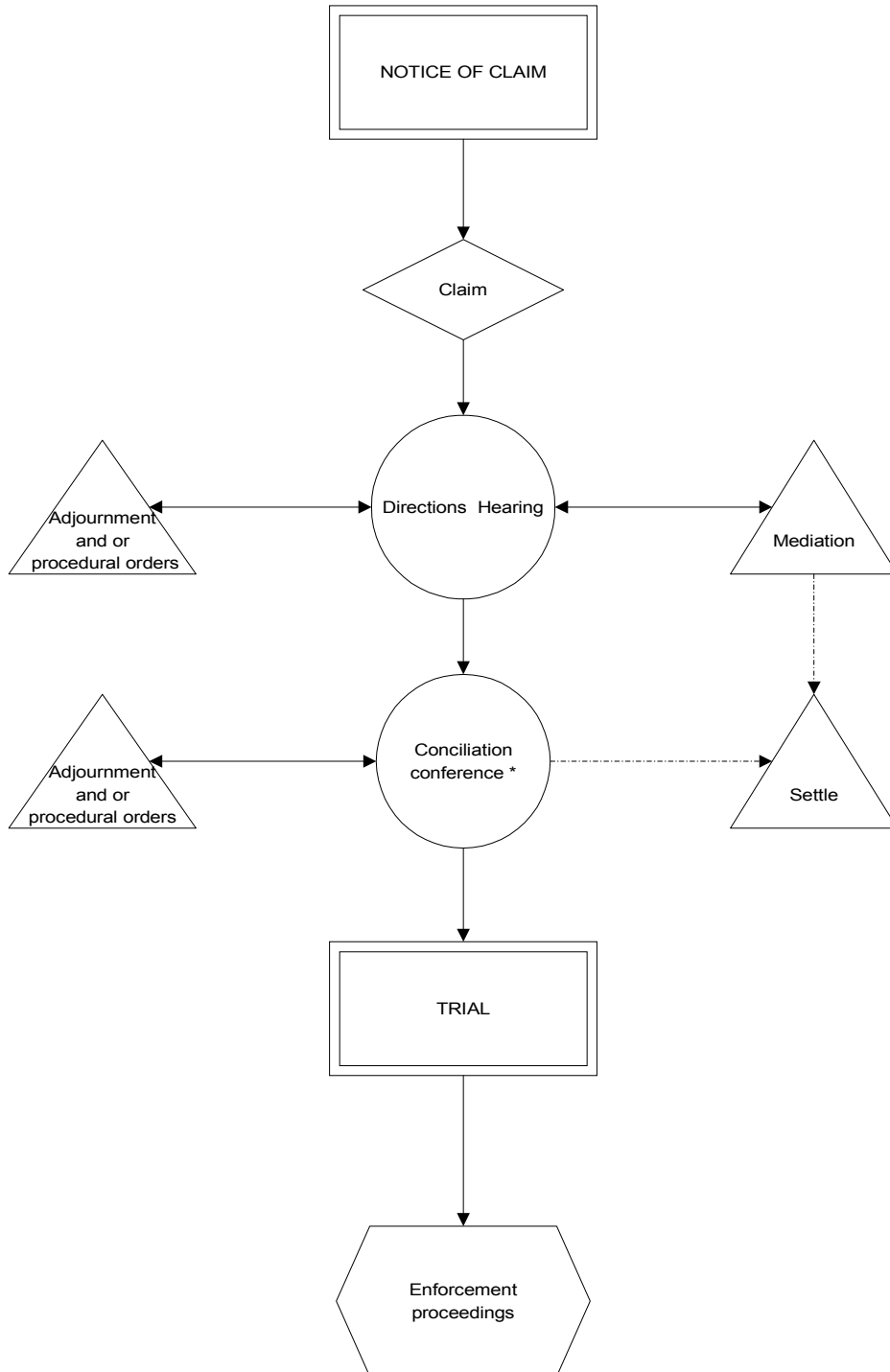


MAGISTRATES COURT - CIVIL JURISDICTION

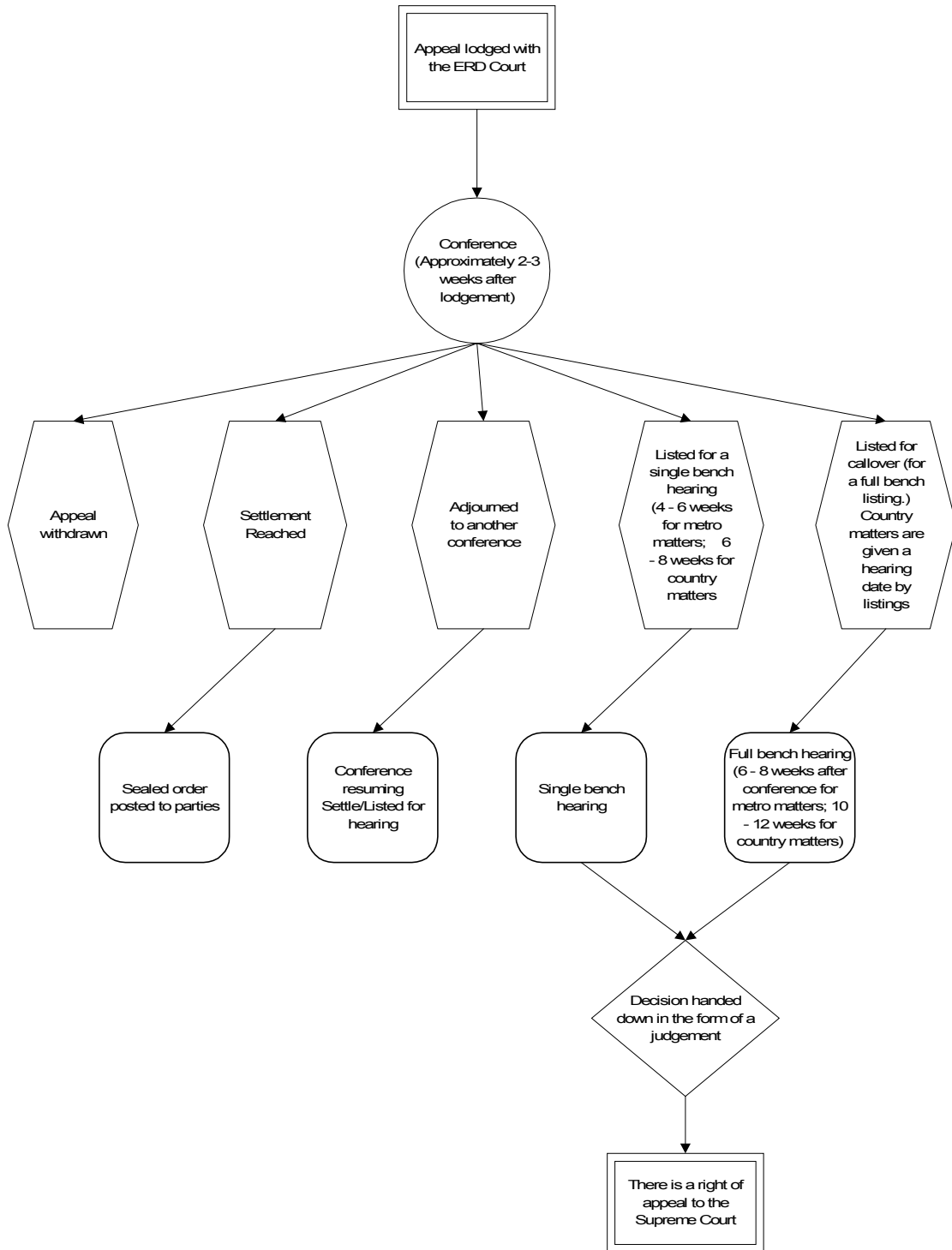
MINOR STATUTORY PROCEEDINGS



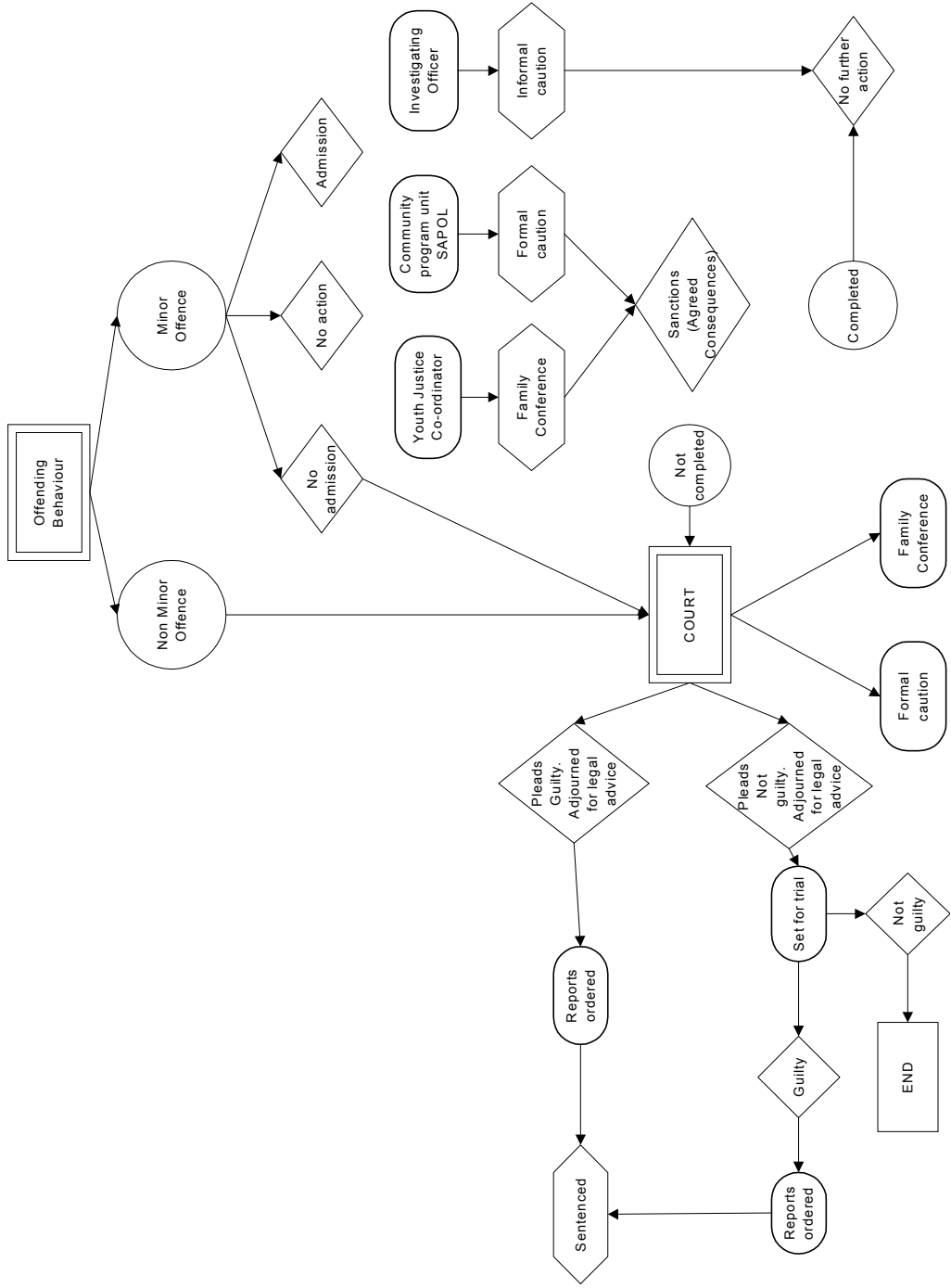
